Sekisui House Recognized as Action Leader on Climate Change Included in CDP A-List for 2018

Sekisui House has been highlighted as a global leader on corporate climate action by environmental impact non-profit CDP*, achieving a place on the CDP Climate Change A List.

Sekisui House early on identified the threat climate change posed to global society, and this lead us to declare in 2008 that we would decarbonize our operations, as part of our 2050 Vision. We were the first company in the Japanese housing industry to be certified as an Eco-First Company by Japan's Ministry of the Environment, and all of our operations aim to tackle the triple challenges of preventing global warming, preserving ecosystems, and creating a recycling-oriented society. We continue to expand our range of eco-friendly dwellings, and are working to make zero-energy houses the industry standard. We also joined the RE100 Initiative in October 2017, and aim to use 100% renewable energy for all of our business operations.



Our environmental actions have been recognized by leading bodies both domestically in Japan and internationally, and our emissions reductions targets were approved by the Science Based Targets (SBT) Initiative in April 2018.

Sekisui House aims to be a leading company in ESG management. We will enhance our actions towards finding solutions to environmental and other issues confronting society, and continue to do our part towards creating a sustainable society.
